Children have been busy programming using Scratch and Python.

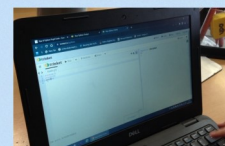
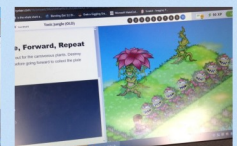
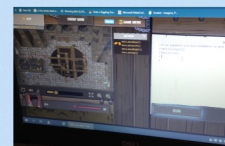
In art, they have been exploring Banksy and Graffiti Name Tags.

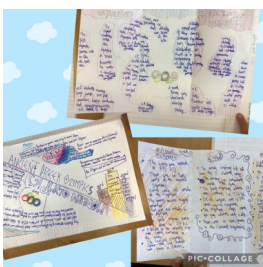
Year 5 - The Ancient Greeks
