



Dear Parents and Carers,

Yesterday the school was notified about our Key Stage 2 SATs results and outcomes. We were delighted with the news. Our children performed admirably and the children did themselves, the school and their families proud. Firstly, in SATs week, the children were calm under pressure and each child gave their very best. Secondly, the children all wanted to do well, but were mature enough and level headed enough to realise that tests are not the key thing in their lives at the moment, which was pleasing. I arrived in school at 7am to log on to the DFE website and it did not stop buffering until ten minutes to nine! I was a nervous wreck.

The results are as follows:

School Reading Results	92% of children reached expected level	Nationally 74% of children reached the age-expected level.
School Grammar and Spelling results	88% of children reached expected level	Nationally, 72% of children reached age-expected level.
School Maths Results	88% of children reached expected level	Nationally, 71% of children reached age-expected level.
Combined Scores (this is the amount of children who passed each test)	83% of children passed all three tests.	Nationally, 59% of children passed all three tests.
School Writing Passes	88% of children reached age-expected level	Nationally, 69% reached expected standard.

As you can see from these figures, our children have performed at a very high level. We are extremely proud of them. I am also very proud of our staff. Here we have a very dedicated group of teachers, teaching assistants, office staff, PSA, dinner staff, cooks, caretaker who all value their jobs highly and put the children's best interests first at all times. This is something we are very proud of.
