We've had another lovely week in Reception, full of creativity, learning, and curiosity! This week, we finished our focus text The Something by Rebecca Cobb. The children impressed with their writing as they created their own 'Ending Elephant' parts of the story — I was so proud! They are becoming confident writers and beginning to show real pride in their work. Our attention is now turning to frogs! We're beginning to explore these fascinating creatures in preparation for writing our very own information pieces. Why not have some fun at home researching together? Maybe you could try a frog-themed craft or go on a little nature hunt to see if you can spot any! In Maths, we're now moving on to addition and subtraction within 10, starting with adding and subtracting 1. The children are enjoying using practical resources and number stories to help them along. A great online game to practise at home is Top Marks' 'Teddy Numbers' or 'Underwater Counting' both are perfect for 4-5 year olds and lots of fun!

A big thank you to all the families who attended our first Parents' Evening — it was truly wonderful to speak with each of you. Positive home-school links are so important in supporting your child's development, and your involvement really does make a difference. 
Another really positive week, Year 4. Keep up the amazing work!
